HAVE YOU HAD A SIMILAR SITUATION? If so, the following suggestions and possible solutions may help reduce your anxiety when you are invited to stay with family and friends, during the upcoming holidays or anytime.

- Don't be afraid to speak to your relatives and friends openly about your concerns -- you might be surprised at the solutions they may come up with. After all, you received the invitation because they care about you and want you to visit. Perhaps they will offer you a room on the first floor or their master bath, which has a more accessible stall shower.
 - Ask if they can pick up a shower chair for you at the local pharmacy or hardware store. These have become common items. The same goes for a toilet seat riser if that will make your stay more comfortable.
 - Sit down and make a list of everything you'll need to bring

- with you, from extra liners and socks to alcohol and skin creams and any tools for minor repairs.
- Bring a folding wheelchair with you for shopping trips or sightseeing. If you don't have one, think about renting one at your destination so you don't get overly tired out. The same goes for navigating the airport. Airports are extremely busy at holiday times, so take advantage of the help available and use wheelchair assistance to get through security lines and to your gate when you need to make connections.
- Be sure to request preferential seating on airplanes so that you can be as comfortable as possible. Call ahead after you have your reservations in order to accomplish this.

 devices. You'll need to be scanned
 and you are entitled to a private
